States Newsroom Employee Census Report | 2023

The following data is reported from two sources: an internal demographic survey administered during the first quarter of 2023; and self-reported EEOC data as of March 2023.

The demographic survey was sent to 164 employees, of which 139 responded (85%). The first sets of data are broken down by role; most employees are reporters and editors (88%), referred to as *Editorial* in this report.

AGE

Across the organization, the majority of staff is under 45 years of age (63%). Below you will find the breakdown between Editorial and Admin staff.



SEXUAL ORIENTATION


23% of States Newsroom staff identify as LGBTQ+, while 4% declined to say.

EDUCATION


Most respondents hold a bachelor's degree or higher (96%); 28% were first-generation college students.
